

# Message from the Executive Director

The RCD has experienced a year of growth, adaptation, and continued dedication to our mission of enhancing the lives of individuals with disabilities in our community.

## Program and Service Highlights:

Our programs and services have seen notable achievements over the past year. The Information and Networking services hit a record-high number of average 1,371 enquiries per month, and in total we provided direct services to 30,464 people for 55,405 direct service chouse.

#### Impact and Outreach:

Our outreach efforts have extended the reach of our services to a broader audience. Through community partnerships, events, and awareness campaigns, we have significantly increased our impact on the lives of those with disabilities. We took part in 16 community events and joined 134 advisory and community meetings; and successfully reached over 700 community members outside our usual networks.

## Collaborations and Partnerships:

Collaboration has been a key theme in our efforts to create a more inclusive community. We have forged meaningful partnerships with several community partners to create cross-sectional synergy and to amplify our impact and bring about positive change. These collaborations have enriched our programs and expanded our resources.

Moreover, the RCD has strengthened within the organization through teamwork and development of talent pool, through skills development and knowledge transfer. Collaborating allows team members to contribute to a larger objective and help fill gaps in individual skill sets; thus enable team members to merge their skills and maximize on the outcomes.

# **Navigating Change – RCD Interim Relocation**

Change is a constant in the journey of any organization, and the RCD faced a unique challenge in the form of an interim relocation in 2023. The transition is expected to be tough, yet it also becomes an opportunity for growth and innovation.

**The Transition Journey:** Due to delay in the re-development of the site where the RCD will assume a permanent home, we were looking into renewing the lease of our current location in mid-2022. The unexpected unfolding that we failed to extend the lease, and an interim relocation will happen in mid-2024 forced the organization to undertake deep assessments of the decision-making process and come to the best possible solution, mostly with the financial burden.

**Maintaining Service Continuity:** Amidst the upcoming relocation, RCD's commitment to its mission remains unwavering. We need to take proactive measures to ensure the uninterrupted delivery of programs and services to individuals with disabilities. We may need to employ different formats of service provision and innovative solutions, to maintain our presence and support within the community, with a goal to demonstrate resilience in the face of change. Whether through virtual initiatives, mobile outreach, or satellite programs, the organization demonstrates its flexibility and creativity in ensuring that persons with disabilities continue to receive the support they need during the relocation phase.

**Engaging the Community:** The interim relocation becomes an opportunity for RCD to strengthen our ties with the community. We have started to engaging open communication with stakeholders, seeking their input and involvement during the transition. The Interim Relocation Fundraising Campaign was launched at the RCD 2023 Fundraising Dinner.

**Learnings and Growth:** The interim relocation provided RCD with invaluable insights. From refining internal processes to exploring new avenues for service delivery and community engagement, RCD is confident to emerge from the interim relocation not just unscathed but stronger and more adaptable than ever.

In the face of temporary upheaval, the RCD past year's work stands as a testament to the organization's ability to navigate change with resilience and innovation. The story of the interim relocation is not just about challenges faced but also about the opportunities seized and the growth that resulted. By transparently sharing this journey, RCD invites its community to appreciate the strength found in adaptability and to look toward the future with confidence and optimism.
